Regulation 231/2012 was fully implemented, with the expansion listed in Column C of Item 9 of Appendix II A to the Law, in addition to the exceptions as stated in Section 3A(a1) to (a5) of the Law. To date, notices have been published in the Official Gazette (Reshumot) that included changes that took place in the European Union in Regulation 231/2012, and were applied in Israel (updates), with the most recent being published on 17 August 2025, being the Public Health Protection Notice (Food) (Application of Changes to the Annex to the European Union Directives) (Regulation 231/2012 - Specifications of Food Additives Listed in Annexes II and III to Regulation No. 1333/2008) (No. 2), 5785-2025, signed by the Director of the National Food Service in the Ministry of Health, as she was then described. The latest updated consolidated version, adopted and published on the Food Service website after the publication of the aforementioned notice, is the version valid in European legislation as it stood on 27 April 2025. It is now proposed to apply in Israel the changes to the Annex to Regulation 231/2012 that will be applied in the European Union, without modifications, conditions, exceptions, or	07/08/2026

expansions, while integrating them into the text of Regulation 231/2012 as adopted today. The essence of the change is in the specification of a food additive. It is clarified that the expansion that appears in column C of item 9 in Appendix II A will continue to apply to the changes proposed to be implemented in Israel. Commission Regulation (EC) No. 1333/2008 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 16 December 2008 regarding food additives was adopted in Israel as part of Amendment No. 10 to the Public Health Protection (Food) Law, 5776-2015 (hereinafter - the Law/Food Law), and appears in Item 8 of Appendix II A to the Law. Regulation 1333/2008 was applied in full, in addition to the exceptions as stated in Section 3A(a1) to (a5) of the Law. To date, notices have been published in the Official Gazette (Reshumot) that included changes that took place in the European Union in Regulation 1333/2008, and which were applied in Israel (updates), with the most recent being published on 24 December 2025, being the Public Health Protection (Food) Notice (Application of Changes in the Annex to the European Union Directives) (Regulation 1333/2008 - Food Additives) (No. 2)(Amendment), 5776-2025, signed by the director of Health Regulation Directorate (Food, Alcoholic Beverages and Cosmetics) at the Ministry of Health. The latest updated consolidated version, adopted and published on the Food Service website following the publication of the aforementioned notice, is the version valid in European legislation as it stood on 31 July 2025. It is now proposed to apply in Israel the change in the Annex to Regulation 1333/2008 that applied in the European Union, without modifications, conditions, exceptions, or expansions, while integrating them into the text of Regulation 1333/2008, as adopted today. The essence of the change is a change in the conditions of use of various food additives. This Regulation enforces the import requirements set in Commission Delegated Regulation (EU) 2023/905, which applies as from 3 September 2026 and incorporates the list into Commission Implementing Regulation (EU) 2021/405.

Commission Implementing Regulation (EU) 2026/1206 of 9 June 2026 amending Implementing Regulation (EU) 2019/1793 as regards the temporary increase of official controls and emergency measures governing the entry into the Union of certain goods from certain third countries (Text with EEA relevance)

Regulation (EU) 2019/1793 lays down rules concerning the temporary increase of official controls upon entry into the Union on certain food and feed of non-animal origin from certain third countries (in Annex I); special import conditions for certain food and feed from certain third countries due to the contamination risk by mycotoxins, including aflatoxins, pesticide residues, and microbiological contamination (in Annex II - increased official border controls and official certificate accompanied by the results of sampling and analysis in the third country). This Implementing Regulation amends Annexes I and II to Implementing Regulation (EU) 2019/1793 by introducing the following changes: Inclusion in Annex I of groundnuts and derived products from Argentina due to risk of contamination by aflatoxins (20%). Increase in the frequency of identity and physical checks laid down in Annex I for the following commodities: Aubergines/eggplants (*Solanum aethiopicum*) from Burkina Faso (pesticide residues: from 20% to 30%); Sugar apple (*Annona squamosa*) from Egypt (pesticide residues: from 20% to 30%); Cumin seeds from India (pesticide residues: from 30% to 50%); Yardlong beans (*Vigna unguiculata* ssp. *sesquipedalis*, *Vigna unguiculata* ssp. *unguiculata*) from Sri Lanka (pesticide residues: from 30% to 50%); Tahini and halva from Sesamum seeds from Syria (*Salmonella*: from 30% to 50%). Removal from Annex II and inclusion in Annex I for the following commodities: Cinnamon (spices) from India (ethylene oxide) (frequency staying at 20%). Decrease in the frequency of identity and physical checks laid down in Annex II for: Xanthan gum from China (ethylene oxide: from 20% to 10%); Nutmeg (*Myristica fragrans*) from Indonesia (aflatoxins: from 50% to 30%). Delisting from Annex I (and thus, from the Regulation) of the following commodities: Peppers of the genus *Capsicum* (sweet or other than sweet) from India - aflatoxins. Splitting of entries of spices from India by individual CN code as detailed possible: Nutmeg, mace and cardamoms (spices) from India – ethylene oxide; Seeds of anise, badian, fennel, coriander, cumin or caraway, juniper berries (spices) from India – ethylene oxide; Ginger, saffron, turmeric (curcuma), thyme, bay leaves, curry and other spices (spices) – ethylene oxide.

Partial amendment to the APQA Notification on (1) the Scope of feed, feed ingredients, equipment, straw litter and other similar items, and (2) Quarantine methods and standards for designated quarantine items

(1) Added honey and bee pollen as feed for bees to the scope of items subject to animal quarantine;(2) Newly established import requirement, quarantine methods and standards for honey and bee pollen as feed for bees.Key details:Honey and bee pollen as feed for bees must comply with the import requirements and be accompanied by an official veterinary quarantine certificate issued by the Veterinary Authority of the exporting country.(Irradiated honey and bee pollen) Honey and bee pollen as feed for bees must be irradiated at an absorbed dose of 15kGy at an irradiation treatment facility. (Irradiation treatment was conducted using Gamma rays emitted from Cobalt-60 (60Co) or Electron beam accelerator not exceeding 10Mev) The irradiation treatment facility must be approved and registered by the exporting country's government and must have been notified to the Korean quarantine authorities prior to export.(Non-irradiated honey and bee pollen) Apiaries and facilities producing honey and bee pollen must meet the following disease-free requirements for honeybee.* Parasitic mites (*Acarapis* spp., *Varroa* spp., *Tropilaelaps* spp. etc); within a 50km radius for at least 2 years prior to the commencement of export quarantine.* American foulbrood, European foulbrood, Nosemosis, Chalkbrood disease, Sacbrood, Bee paralysis; within a 10km radius for at least 2 years prior to the commencement of export quarantine.Please refer to the attached document for further details.

The draft Resolution has been developed to approve the forms of the Common Veterinary Entry Document for live animals (CVED-A), the Common Veterinary Entry Document for products (CVED-P) and the Common Entry Document (CED) for feed of non-animal origin and food of non-animal origin subject to an increased level of state control, in accordance with the Law of Ukraine "On State Control over Compliance with Legislation on Food, Feed, Animal By-products, Animal Health and Welfare" (notified in document G/SPS/N/UKR/123).The draft Resolution also provides that, upon its entry into force, Resolution of the Cabinet of Ministers of Ukraine No. 570 of 18 July 2018 “On Approval of the Form of the Common Veterinary Entry

Document for Imports and the Common Entry Document for Imports” (notified in document G/SPS/N/UKR/121) shall be repealed.

Seeds for sowing and pollen for pollination (when imported by hand-carried baggage, mail, courier service, or household goods) 11/08/2026

Notification of change of Phytosanitary measure for seeds for sowing and pollen for pollination without a Phytosanitary Certificate

The Republic of Korea has amended its phytosanitary regulation concerning the importation of seeds for sowing and pollen for pollination. Effective 5 September 2026, all imports of seed for sowing and pollen for pollination must be accompanied by a phytosanitary certificate issued by the NPPO of the exporting country, regardless of the means of transport or quantity. This phytosanitary measure has been introduced to address the risk associated with the detection of unauthorized living modified organisms (LMOs) and quarantine pests in imported seeds.
