The draft technical regulation (QCVN) lays down mandatory technical requirements, limit values, test methods and sampling procedures for high-risk and medium-risk building-material products and goods manufactured domestically, imported, placed on the market and used in Viet Nam.

The main amendments and additions include:

- reclassifying and restructuring the list of covered products according to risk level;
- updating essential technical characteristics, limit values, referenced standards, test methods and sampling procedures;
- adding certain new materials and filling/embankment materials derived from industrial by-products;
- specifying principles for conformity assessment and declaration of conformity, using Method 2, Method 5 or Method 7 depending on the product and risk level;
- for high-risk products, declaration of conformity is based on certification by a certification body designated by the Ministry of Construction; for medium-risk products, declaration of conformity may be based on certification by an accredited/designated certification body or on self-assessment supported by test results issued by an accredited/designated testing body;
- establishing responsibilities of relevant organizations and individuals, together with transitional provisions for existing certificates, conformity-assessment dossiers, products already manufactured or imported, and conformity-assessment bodies.

This draft national technical regulation does not specify the procedures for quality management of construction materials and products manufactured specifically for a construction project and not independently circulated in the market. The quality of these products is managed according to construction laws, design documents, technical specifications, and applicable standards for the project.

Exemption or reduction of state inspection of imported goods does not change the responsibility to ensure that the goods comply with the technical requirements of this regulation, except where the law provides otherwise.

This draft national technical regulation applies to:

- Organizations and individuals producing, importing, trading, distributing, and using construction materials and products within the scope of this Standard.
- Testing organizations and certification organizations conducting conformity assessment activities for construction materials and products.
- State management agencies, product and goods quality inspection agencies, and other relevant organizations and individuals.

Pursuant to Article 5(6), of Regulation (EU) 2024/3110, the Commission is supplementing those Regulation by laying down conditions under which a product is to be deemed to satisfy a certain level, threshold level or to qualify for a class of performance without testing.

The latest updated combined version that was adopted and published on the Ministry's website is the correct version as of April 1, 2025.

Section 1(4) of Regulation 1169/2011 states that the regulation applies without prejudice to the requirements of specific labeling applicable to certain foods. In Israel, this section is read together with sections 3A(a1)(1) and 3A(a2) of the law, so that the meaning is that where there is specific local food legislation regarding certain foods, it applies. Local food legislation regarding certain foods is expressed, among other things, in official standards, which refer, among other things, to Mandatory Israel standard SI 1145 for food labeling provisions.

In order to allow food labeling in accordance with the provisions of Regulation 1169/2011 together with the specific labeling provisions existing in local food legislation applicable to certain foods (and this is to the extent that European provisions have not been adopted for these certain foods), it is proposed to cancel the reference to SI 1145 from those specific labeling provisions and replace it with a reference to Regulation 1169/2011.

UAE Technical Regulation "Labeling – Energy Efficiency Label for Electrical Appliances Part 11: Energy Consumption Efficiency for Computer Monitors

This draft UAE technical regulation specifies the energy efficiency and energy labeling requirements for computer monitors placed on the UAE market. It applies to desktop computer monitors, professional graphics monitors, gaming monitors, and the display component of all-in-one computers, while excluding products such as projectors, laptops, tablets, medical displays, virtual reality headsets, security displays, industrial control panels, and interactive displays.

The draft establishes:

- Maximum energy consumption limits for On Mode, Off Mode, Standby Mode, and Networked Standby Mode;

- Requirements for Automatic Brightness Control (ABC), peak white luminance, and automatic standby functionality;
- A methodology for calculating the Energy Efficiency Index (EEI) and classifying products into energy efficiency classes;
- Additional power allowances for high-resolution and high-refresh-rate monitors; and
- Energy labeling requirements, including the design and content of the energy label, such as the EEI, star rating, energy consumption, screen size, resolution, QR code, and model identification.

The draft is based on IEC 62087-1:2015 and IEC 62087-7:2018 for the measurement of power consumption of computer monitors. Its objective is to improve energy efficiency, provide consumers with clear and comparable energy performance information, reduce electricity consumption, and support the UAE's energy conservation and sustainability objectives.

UAE Technical Regulations for Labeling – Energy Efficiency Label for Electrical Appliances Part 12: Energy Consumption Efficiency for Televisions and Electronic Displays

This draft UAE Standard establishes the energy efficiency and energy labeling requirements for televisions and electronic displays placed on the market in the United Arab Emirates. It applies to televisions and other electronic displays while excluding displays with a screen area below 100 cm², projectors, integrated displays in smartphones, tablets and laptops, medical imaging displays, virtual reality headsets, security and surveillance displays, and industrial control panels.

The draft specifies:

- Maximum allowable energy consumption limits for On Mode, Off Mode, Standby Mode, and Networked Standby Mode;
 - Energy consumption calculation methods based on display technology, screen area, and additional allowances for high-resolution (4K/8K) and HDR displays;
 - Requirements for automatic power-down functionality;
 - A methodology for calculating the Energy Efficiency Index (EEI) and assigning products to energy efficiency classes;
 - Verification testing requirements; and
 - Mandatory energy labeling requirements, including the design and content of the energy label, such as the energy efficiency class, QR code, energy consumption values, screen size, screen resolution, and other product information.
- The draft is based on IEC 62087-1:2015 and GSO IEC 62087-3:2024 for measuring the power consumption of televisions and electronic displays. Its objective is to improve the energy performance of electronic displays, provide consumers with transparent and comparable energy efficiency information, reduce electricity consumption, and support the UAE's energy efficiency and sustainability objectives.

Significant New Use Rules on Certain Chemical Substances (26-3)

Proposed rule - The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) is proposing significant new use rules (SNURs) under the Toxic Substances Control Act (TSCA) for certain chemical substances that were the subject of premanufacture notices (PMNs) and are also subject to an Order issued by EPA pursuant to TSCA. Once finalized, the SNURs would require persons who intend to manufacture (defined by statute to include import) or process any of these chemical substances for an activity that is proposed as a significant new use by this rulemaking to notify EPA at least 90 days before commencing that activity. The required notification initiates EPA's evaluation of the conditions of that use for that chemical substance. In addition, the manufacture or processing for the significant new use may not commence until EPA has conducted a review of the required notification, made an appropriate determination regarding that notification, and taken such actions as required by that determination.
